

Parking System

The Path to Prominence relies heavily on development proposed on existing surface parking lot facilities throughout the Asa Packer Campus. Current development plans, population growth, coupled with the implementation of the car free zone, is expected to impact approximately 600 parking spaces. Effective and properly-utilized parking will support the needs of the campus in a more sustainable manner. Lehigh will implement a parking strategy to accommodate demand in a sustainable way.





Parking System - Goals

- Increase parking efficiency by taking advantage of currently underutilized parking areas.
- Upgrade our parking facilities to comply with ADA guidelines supported by a transit service.
- Limit vehicular access and parking throughout the core campus and establish the car-free zone.
- Remove parking while limiting access of cars and service trucks throughout the primary pedestrian campus routes.
- Maximize the efficiency of existing parking supply and reducing the reliance on the personal vehicle by assigning every parking permit issued to only one (1) specific location (location based parking).





Parking System - Goals

- Continually assess parking demand on the Asa Packer Campus and encourage use of commuter parking areas in order to reduce demand.
- Partner with the City of Bethlehem and lease parking from the City as required by demand to provide parking inventory within walkable distance to Asa Packer Campus.
- Offer designated parking zones to faculty and staff
- Reduce the number of students with vehicles through effective transportation alternatives.





What's Changing?

Over the next 8 years Path to Prominence Initiatives throughout campus will result in changes to existing parking inventory on Asa Packer Campus. The following parking lots will be affected by various projects:

- Whitaker Parking Lot Health Science Technology Building
- Parking Inventory in the Campus Core Car-Free Zone
- Webster & Packer Parking Lot Executive Business School
- Trembley and Kappa Delta Parking Lots Bridge West Housing
- Expansion of Programming on Mountaintop Campus
- Expansion of Academic Programming on Asa Packer Campus
- Increase in Student Population





New Street Garage Parking for Visitors



Parking Assignment

- Beginning July 1, 2019, all permit holders at Lehigh University will be assigned to a Campus Parking Zone based upon campus address on a first-come first-serve basis.
- In the event all parking permits available for a parking zone are sold out, permit applicants may choose to be placed on a waitlist and may elect to park in the Mountaintop or SouthSide campus parking zone (also first-come first-serve), in the Goodman Campus Commuter Lot, or in the Northside Commuter Lot.
- Parking permit fees vary based upon parking zone.






Designated Parking Zone per Campus Address






CAMPUS PARKING ZONES

FACULTY/STAFF RESERVED PARKING FACILITIES










Alumni Parking Zone

CAMPUS PARKING ZONES












Farrington Parking Zone








Sayre Parking Zone








Asa Packer Residential Parking Zone








Mountaintop Parking Zone



FACULTY/STAFF RESERVED PARKING FACILITIES

SouthSide Parking Zone

- This zone is owned, operated and under the jurisdiction of Bethlehem Parking Authority.
- Only SouthSide LU permit holders who are issued an access card by the Parking Services office may park in the New Street Garage as part of their permit privileges (12 AM to 12 PM).
- Anyone may pay to park in this garage at the BPA parking rate of \$1 per hour or for \$65 per month.
- Chaser cards for Visitors pay be purchased for use in the New Street Garage.
- LU permits issued for any other parking zone are not valid in the New Street Garage at any time.








Goodman & Saucon Village Parking Zone

Commuter Lot Permit Perks

\$0 Parking Permit at the Goodman Commuter Lot or Northside Lot gets you:

- Two (2) free Daily Visitor Passes, issued as a credit with the purchase (\$0) of an annual permit
- Alternate Parking Location during "Snow Alerts" within walking distance of Asa Packer Campus
- Two (2) codes for the On-Demand Transportation program (Lyft) for use anytime of the year at your discretion.





Location-Based* Permit Fees

\$500 – All Asa Packer and SouthSide Campus Parking Zones

\$250 – Mountaintop, Upper Residential, 125 Goodman, 126 Goodman, Goodman Lot E, and Saucon Village Day Care

\$0 – Goodman Commuter Lot, Northside Commuter Lot Cost of "Evening and Weekend Permit" is additional

2 Daily Visitor Passes Included: All Faculty and Staff, Wage Employee, On-Campus Vendor, and Non-Residential RA/GA/TA permits will include 2 Daily Visitor Passes.

*Not all permit applicants are eligible for Asa Packer Campus, SouthSide or Mountaintop Campus Permit Zones. Eligibility is based upon Campus Address and residential status on campus.





Academic Break Permit

- \$190 Academic Break Permit for Faculty, Staff, RA/GA/TA, Wage and Vendors
 - Includes "Evening and Weekend" Permit Privileges
 - Allows parking on Asa Packer Campus in an assigned Campus Parking Zone during Winter Break, Spring Break, Pacing Break and Summer Break.
 - A schedule of valid dates will be provided.





Evening & Weekend Permit

• \$86 - Anyone within the Lehigh University Community may obtain an Evening and Weekend Permit authorizing parking in all Faculty/Staff Reserved Campus Parking Zones (except reserved, prohibited, metered, and pay-by-space zones) Monday through Friday from 4 PM to 11 PM and on weekends from 7 AM to 11 PM.

New Street Garage Exception:

- Only SouthSide LU permit holders who are issued an access card by the Parking Services office may park in the New Street Garage as part of their permit privileges (12 AM to 12 PM).
- LU permits issued for any other parking zone are not valid in the New Street Garage at any time.






All car pool participants will receive:

- Free membership in Car Share program



Daily Visitor Pass for Personal Use

- Daily visitor passes may be purchased by any LU permit holder outside of their 'assigned' permit zone on special need days (Parking Services will assign a zone based upon daily availability of parking).
- Two (2) daily visitor passes are included with all faculty and staff permits, including the Goodman Commuter Lot permit zone.





Visitors to Campus

- Prospective Students and their families visiting Admissions will be permitted to park for free in the Alumni Garage. They have two options available:
 - Pre-Registered Visitors will be required to place a printed copy of their registration confirmation page issued by Admissions.
 - Walk-In's will be provided a registration confirmation placard at the Admissions Welcome Desk upon registering.
- Iacocca Hall Visitor Parking Lot
 - Anyone with a vehicle registered to a Lehigh University Permit will not be eligible to park in the Iacocca Hall Visitor lot when the lot is reserved for events during the peak academic day 6:00 AM to 4:00 PM
 - Parking Attendants will be located at the Visitor Parking Lot on Conference Services event days.
 - Pay-by-space
- Goodman Campus, with the exception of reserved faculty/staff parking areas, will remain open to the public for visitor parking
- Parking Meters and Pay-By-Space areas will remain throughout campus
- All other visitors to campus who wish to park in Campus Permit Zones must purchase a Daily Visitor Pass.





Parking Meters and Pay-By-Space Zones

Parking Spaces along Brodhead Avenue, Packer Avenue, Webster Street, and Morton Street are under the jurisdiction of Bethlehem Parking Authority. Lehigh University Parking Services has no jurisdiction over these on-street meters. BPA meters can be reserved in advance for events at the rate of \$15 per day from the Bethlehem Parking Authority.


Daily Visitor Pass for Visitors to Campus


- Any member of the Lehigh University Community may purchase a Daily Visitor Pass for guests to campus. Visitors not within the campus community must demonstrate cause for Daily Visitor Pass. Visitors of students must have the Lehigh University registered student obtain the Daily Visitor Pass.
- Any Department at Lehigh University may request up to ten (10) Daily Visitor Passes through the online Parking Portal. The parking permit(s) fee shall be paid in advance by Department or individual requesting visitor pass. If more than ten (10) Daily Visitor Passes are required, please refer to regulations for "Campus Projects and Events".
- The default form of Visitor Pass shall be issued via a promotional code for the smartphone application Passport Parking Mobile Pay.
- Parking Services shall assign Daily Visitor Passes to a specific Campus Parking Zone location based upon available parking facility capacity.
- Permit holders who wish to park in a different parking zone due to special circumstance (such as doctor's appointment, early-dismissal for a child, or temporary change in work address) may obtain a Daily Visitor Pass.

Reserved Spaces per American's with Disabilities Act (ADA)



Have you noticed us working?

Parking Services is currently upgrading all campus parking facilities with new ADA signage and striping.

You will notice more ADA Reserved Parking Spaces for vans and cars throughout campus.

Lehigh University is committed to providing an accessible campus to our community.





Reserved Spaces per American's with Disabilities Act (ADA)

- Lehigh University permit holders may only park in ADA Parking Spaces if they are displaying a state issued American's with Disability (ADA) Plate or hangtag or a Lehigh issued hangtag.
- Vehicles in an un-metered space must display a permit valid for the designated Lehigh University parking zone.
- Vehicles in a metered space with a Blue Meter must pay meter rate.
- ADA Parking Spaces provided in Faculty/Staff Parking Facilities or Student Parking Facilities (permitted lots) are only available for assigned permit holders to that campus parking zone. Visitors eligible for use of ADA Reserved Spaces must have a Daily Visitor Pass or utilize the pay-by-space or meters available in Zoellner Garage, Alumni Garage and Mountaintop Campus. On-street meters are under the jurisdiction of the Bethlehem Parking Authority.
- Parking Services will make every effort to provide an assigned location for Daily Visitor Pass permittees eligible for ADA Reserved Spaces to the closest location to their destination. In the event the location is within the Car-Free Zone, AccessLU may be utilized.
- Individual reserved spaces will not be provided for medical needs.





Short Term Parking

- Short Term Parking will be available
 - Taylor Street, adjacent to Grace Hall
 - University Drive, from Quad Drive to Rathbone.
- Parking Meters will be converted to "Short Term Faculty/Staff" parking spaces. Permit holders will be notified at time of permit application if their permit is valid in these spaces.
- Faculty, Staff, and Non-Residential RA/GA/TA students will be eligible to park in "Short Term Faculty/Staff" parking spaces for a maximum of 2 hours.
- If a car is relocated from one "Short Term Faculty/Staff" space to another within the same zone resulting in excess of 2 hours with the same day, it will be issued a citation.
- All users of the "Short Term Faculty/Staff" parking spaces must be a valid Lehigh University parking permit holder.





What if I do not get my preferred parking location?

- Request to be placed on a waitlist for your preferred zone
- Consider parking at the other locations available Mountaintop Campus, Goodman Commuter Lot or Northside Commuter Lot
- Consider carpool, public transit, vanpool, or other forms of transportation.
- Purchase a Parking Permit Direct from Bethlehem Parking Authority
 - New Street Garage \$65 per month \$780 per year
 - Mechanic Street \$40-\$50 per month \$480 to \$600 per year
